# Michigan's trauma system

## needs stable funding and appropriate resources in order to eliminate preventable trauma-related deaths

Long-term, sustainable funding is essential for our trauma system to meet the needs of treatable trauma injuries. Too many lives are lost in our state because funding is inadequate to maintain and update facilities, equipment and personnel training.

Uncontrolled bleeding is a major cause of preventable deaths. Approximately 40 percent of trauma-related deaths are due to bleeding or its consequences.

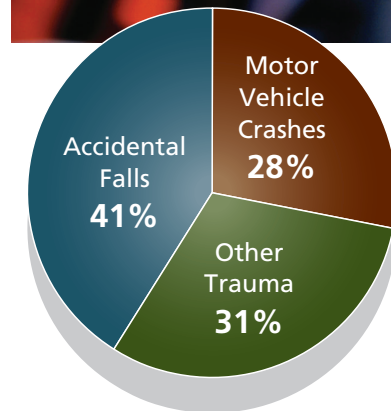


*Lost minutes cost lives when trauma victims who have treatable injuries bleed to death.*

## Our trauma system is an incomplete patchwork of facilities, personnel, training and equipment

### Michigan can upgrade its trauma system and Stop the Bleed by:

- Providing permanent funding for state-of-the-art facilities, communication systems and properly trained trauma staff.
- Making emergency medical services a seamless component of health care delivery, rather than a mere transport mechanism.
- Developing career paths for trauma care.
- Promoting public education to empower people to learn to Stop the Bleed.
