Advocacy vs. Lobbying

- All lobbying is advocacy, but not all advocacy is lobbying!
- Advocacy: The act of arguing in favor of or against an idea or concept, such as an idea that Michigan is a safer place with every person who is trained in Stop the Bleed.
- I raising your voice!
 - Advocacy is NOT arguing in favor of or against a piece of legislation
 - There is no limit to the amount of non-lobbying advocacy your organization can do.

Advocacy vs. Lobbying

- Lobbying: (as defined by federal tax law): Any attempt to influence specific legislation. Lobbying can be done in two ways:
 - Contacting or urging the public to contact policy makers for the purpose of proposing, supporting, or opposing legislation, or
 - By advocating the adoption or rejection of legislation.
 - Lobbying involves three parts: Communication, Direct Lobbying and Grassroots Lobbying

Lobbying

- Communication: With a policy maker that takes a position on specific, pending legislation.
- Grassroots lobbying: Any attempt to influence legislation by affecting the opinion of the general public. The organization refers to a specific piece of legislation and provides information to the public on how to contact decision makers.
- Direct lobbying: Any attempt to influence legislation through communication with any member or employee of a legislative body, or with any other government official who may participate in the formulation of legislation.

Advocacy vs. Lobbying Examples

Advocacy

- Sharing success stories
- Informing legislator about the impact a piece of legislation has on the trauma system- with no request for action
- Distributing your annual report or brochures
- Meeting with legislators or staff to discuss your mission

Lobbying


- Informing legislator about the impact a piece of legislation has on the trauma system and, requesting they take action
- Engaging members of the public to encourage a legislator take action on a piece of legislation
- Publicly communicate an opinion on a piece of legislation

Role of a Legislator

- Will advocate for your state issues, and help with local issues that may be resolved at the state level
- They are elected by YOU to represent YOU at the state level
- They need to hear from YOU to know HOW to represent YOU
- How does your legislator hear from you?
- Where to find your legislator: Michigan House & Michigan Senate

- At introduction
 - Before introduction
 - After introduction in anticipation of committee
- In committee
 - In committee bills can be refined before going to the floor
 - On the HOUSE or SENATE Floor
 - This is when calling, being at session or email works the best
